

The Children's Cardiomyopathy Foundation (CCF) manages the **Cardiomyopathy Center of Care Program**. A CCF Center of Care recognizes medical centers with expertise in pediatric cardiomyopathy. A hospital that is a recognized Center of Care provides high-quality cardiac care and specialized disease management to children with cardiomyopathy. A center is required to meet the below criteria before being recognized as a CCF Cardiomyopathy Center of Care.

Basic Center Requirements

Centers must meet <u>all</u> of the below requirements:

- Manages on an annual basis <u>30 or more</u> cardiomyopathy patients (birth to 18 years) or <u>60 or</u> <u>more</u> pediatric cardiomyopathy patient visits a year (excluding post-transplant patients)
- At least two pediatric cardiologists who treats patients with dilated, hypertrophic, restrictive, arrhythmogenic right ventricular, and/or left ventricular non-compaction cardiomyopathy
- A teaching hospital affiliated with a medical school
- Offers the following services for the diagnosis and treatment of pediatric cardiomyopathy:
 - Prenatal or fetal echocardiography
 - High quality imaging (echocardiogram, cardiac magnetic resonance imaging)
 - Interventional cardiology (catheterization, endomyocardial biopsy)
 - Pediatric cardiac electrophysiology
 - Cardiac surgical services (septal myectomy, cardiac device implantation)
 - Genetic testing and counseling
 - Pediatric neurology
 - Social work
 - Child life
 - Pediatric heart transplant program or has an active collaboration with a pediatric heart transplant program
 - Pediatric mechanical support program, including ability to place a durable assist device, or has an active collaboration with a pediatric mechanical support program

Additional Center Requirements

Centers also must meet at least one of the following requirements:

- Offers a specialized clinic or program focused on pediatric cardiomyopathy with a dedicated team of pediatric cardiologists, electrophysiologist, pediatric geneticists, neurologists, cardiac surgeons, pediatric social worker, and child life specialist
- Involved with the North America Pediatric Cardiomyopathy Registry, Pediatric Cardiomyopathy Repository, or Pediatric Heart Transplant Study Group
- Engages in pediatric cardiomyopathy research
- Offers advanced heart failure management and pediatric heart transplantation services
