## **ABOUT THE VENUE**

CCF's popular golf event returns this summer at the historic Ridgewood Country Club. Founded in 1890, the club is listed by the U.S. Golf Association as one of the oldest golf clubs in America. The 27-hole layout was designed by A.W. Tillinghast, who is also known for Winged Foot and Baltusrol.

Professional golfers like Vijay Singh, Matt Kuhar, Bryson DeChambeau, and Tiger Woods have all played at Ridgewood's championship course in Northern New Jersey. Regarded as one of the top golf courses in the world, Ridgewood has hosted many prestigious golf tournaments, including the Northern Trust FedExCup PGA Tour Playoffs four times in its 12-year history.

## ABOUT THE FOUNDATION

The Children's Cardiomyopathy Foundation (CCF) is a national nonprofit dedicated to finding causes and cures for pediatric cardiomyopathy, a chronic and potentially life-threatening heart disease.

The Foundation started in 2002 when one parent saw the need to raise awareness of a poorly understood disease and to accelerate collaborative research on a rare condition. Nineteen years later, CCF has grown into a global community of families, physicians, and scientists focused on improving diagnosis, treatment, and quality of life for children with cardiomyopathy.

Proceeds from the Golf for a Cure event will go towards multi-center research studies with the National Institutes of Health-funded Pediatric Cardiomyopathy Registry. As a result of CCF's research and education initiatives, there have been more than 420 medical publications and presentations on pediatric cardiomyopathy. This has provided guidance to physicians caring for children with cardiomyopathy and led to improved health outcomes and increased survival.
