Twenty-three years ago, Eddie and I founded the Children's Cardiomyopathy Foundation (CCF) in memory of our two young sons, Bryan and Kevin, who passed from hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. Thanks to friends, families and supporters, like you, CCF has advanced life-saving research, introduced first-time legislation and created an international community of support.

This year marked a milestone for CCF with the Cardiomyopathy HEARTS Act signed into law. The bipartisan legislation, which CCF took the lead on, is the first to focus on pediatric cardiomyopathy and requests the development and distribution of educational materials and resources through public schools.

In addition, CCF funded research resulted in five peer-reviewed publications and several medical presentations. Plus, CCF expanded its virtual educational programming, hosting five "Experts on Pediatric Cardiomyopathy" webinars to meet the informational needs of physicians and caregivers.

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#### ABOUT THE FOUNDATION

Pediatric cardiomyopathy is a rare disease of the heart muscle that affects how the heart pumps blood. It is often underdiagnosed and frequently misdiagnosed. In young children, cardiomyopathy can be life-threatening, progressing to heart failure, sudden cardiac arrest or a heart transplant. Currently, there is no cure.

The Children's Cardiomyopathy Foundation (CCF) was founded in 2002 to find causes and cures for pediatric cardiomyopathy. CCF's commitment to fostering research collaborations, physician-led team science and partnership among academic medical centers has led to advances in how patients are treated, managed and supported. CCF-funded research has been featured in 260+ publications in leading peer-reviewed medical and scientific journals. In addition, CCF research findings have been presented at 205+ national and regional medical meetings and scientific conferences.

Every year, CCF hosts dozens of educational webinars for families and health care professionals to provide the latest updates on research and standards of care. This has enabled caregivers and care providers to make informed decisions about managing a child with cardiomyopathy.

CCF continues to expand its global community of families, physicians and supporters to improve health outcomes and quality of life for children with cardiomyopathy. At the same time, CCF is partnering with researchers and the pharmaceutical industry to accelerate the development of new therapies.
